**Mission Statement of Grace Lutheran Church** Proclaiming the grace of Christ through Word and Sacrament

As Christ bids his Church in the Great Commission (Matt 28:19-20) to go into all the world, making disciples for him by baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything he has commanded, Grace Lutheran Church's mission is to proclaim him in just this way.

One, we will proclaim him in Word. We will do so in worship where we use the public service or liturgy: praying, singing hymns, reading Scripture, preaching, and proclaiming his death through Holy Communion until Christ returns in glory (1 Cor 11:26).

Two, as the preceding reference states, we will proclaim him through the Sacrament of Holy Communion, and in further fulfillment of the Great Commission, we will proclaim him in the Sacrament of Holy Baptism by baptizing those whom we teach his ways.

We see no clearer way to proclaim Christ's grace than by obeying the mission he has already given the whole Church.
